The response is as follows:

QUESTION: What is the processing time right now for current applications? Is there a ballpark? What is the current number of applications that are being processed by the department? What is the current number of successful nominees in the territory? Can we get an idea of how many job site visits there were? Is that per nominee or is that for job placement?

ANSWER: The current processing time for applications under the Yukon Nominee Program is eight to twelve weeks after receipt of a completed application. This includes document verification.

So far in 2017 the department has received 69 applications under the Yukon Nominee Program (as of May 26, 2017). 30 of these have been approved, 9 have been denied or revoked, and 30 are pending.

Since the inception of the Yukon Nominee Program in 2007, the department has approved 1,070 Yukon Nominee Program applications.

All successful applicants sign a tripartite agreement (employer, employee, Immigration Unit). The department conducts 'e-monitoring' (separate questionnaire forms are sent to the employee and the employer) within three months after each agreement is signed. If no issues are identified, follow-up monitoring is done four months later, or as often as deemed necessary by the Immigration Unit. On-site workplace monitoring is done randomly, and so far in 2017 Immigration Unit staff have done 15 on-site employer monitoring visits.
