THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to work with the Government of Canada to ensure the RCMP detachment building in Faro is replaced, and to create a plan going forward for the renovation or replacement of one RCMP detachment building every five years, as outlined in the 2012 *Territorial Police Service Agreement* between Canada and Yukon.

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to begin community consultation to move forward with the rehabilitation of the Nisutlin Bay bridge.
