Motions Other Than Government Motions

1. Motion No. 110
Mr. Hassard, Leader of the Official Opposition
THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to review the annual budget for weed and brush control on Yukon's highways in order to ensure it adequately addresses highway maintenance needs for the 2017-18 fiscal year as well as future years.
2. Motion No. 111
Mr. Hassard, Leader of the Official Opposition
THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to return to the proactive practice of posting and disclosing ministerial travel expenses no later than three months after travel.
3. Motion No. 112

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to plan for a referendum on electoral reform to take place during the next territorial general election in order to ensure a high voter response rate.

THAT this House urges the Government of Yukon to abandon its current plan to impose \$216 million in red in debt on Yukon, and to be transparent with Yukoners regarding how far it is willing to go into debt over its term in government.
